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Social Studies

This week in SS, students began to learn about westward expansion and the Corps of Discovery! Students researched Lewis and Clark's expedition and wrote journal entries. This was a wonderful and engaging activity!

Next week, we will begin a unit on the Civil War!

Science

This week in Science we took a deep dive into the formation of three main types of rocks: igneous, metamorphic, and sedimentary. Students learned about the different processes that led to the creation of each type of rock, from the cooling and solidification of molten lava for igneous rocks, to the heat and pressure that transform existing rocks into metamorphic rocks, to the accumulation and cementation of sediments for sedimentary rocks. Students explored the continuous process by which rocks are transformed from one type into another over time through processes like weathering, erosion, and melting. A few highlights of the week were making our own sedimentary rock, and beginning a mini research project on a rock of choice.

We will continue Ch. 7 next week.

Math

This week, students have been mastering the skills of multiplying whole numbers by fractions, and multiplying whole numbers with mixed numbers. It has been fantastic to see their problem-solving skills in action as they tackle these more complex mathematical tasks. Putting their multiplication skills into context, students have been practicing solving word problems that involve these operations. The word problems have challenged students to apply their mathematical understanding to real-life situations, helping them develop critical thinking and problem solving strategies.

Today we took our test over Unit 11. Next week we look forward to learning about decimals in Unit 12.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in LA, students continued a cross curricular research project in which they are researching a sub topic of the American Revolution. This group research project will push students to learn more about the American Revolution and sharpen their critical thinking and research skills.

Next week, we will continue this unit.

Theology

This week in Theology, students completed their Unit 3 Lesson 12 quiz, demonstrating their understanding of the Beatitudes, the Theological Virtues, and the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. As part of our exploration of our March tenet of the month "compassion", we've been studying the life of St. Therese of Lisieux. Known for her profound love and empathy for others, she serves as a beautiful example of compassion in action. Through our in class activities, students have been inspired by her life and legacy.

We're excited to report that we've had two successful Passion Play rehearsals this week. The students have been working diligently to bring the story of Jesus' passion and resurrection to life. They've received the bare bones of their costumes, and we encourage you to refer to the costume email sent out last week for ideas on how to enhance the pieces they've been given. Please remember to ensure that your child has a pair of brown open-toe sandals for their costume; flip flops are not permitted.

Next week, we will begin Unit 3 Lesson 13: "How does God teach us to love?" We will explore our understanding of the 10 Commandments, and 4B will begin planning Mass for the feast of Saint Joseph on Tuesday, March 19th.
