Read at least one story or fluency passage to an adult each night. Practice reading nonsense words or other cvc words. Practice sight words. Write a story using sight words. **Math Practice at Home**

Tell the time on a clock in your house to the hour or half hour.

Identify coins and count change.

Add or subtract items in your house or while shopping at the store.

Group and count objects in your house.

Count to 100 by ones, fives, and tens.

Practice reading page numbers.

Identify and create patterns.

Measure items in the kitchen or garden.

Recite address and phone number.

Next Week


We plan to continue learning about living and nonliving and do Easter activities. April: Easter, plants, weather, seasons, different classifications of animals and their characteristics.

Please have your child read the fluency passages to you five or more times to build reading fluency. Students are enjoying their book buddies on Wednesdays and Thursdays.
