K-2: Basketball intro and Striking with Implements - We have been using "implements" learning to strike while using many different types of objects (i.e foam stick, bat, paddles, etc.) to hit other objects (ball.) We have also begun improving hand-eye coordination skills while using basketballs to play several activities. Occasionally, we will supplement a basketball with other softer and lighter objects so that we can still safely perform the skills!

3-5: Basketball Skills - This is always a fun unit for this group. Huge emphasis is placed on hand eye coordination skills, footwork skills, and movement skills all while learning the basics of a popular game. Basketball is widely recognized and we just hope to have some general knowledge and skill practice. The idea is to sharpen fine motor skills, gross motor skills, and social skills through basketball basics such as dribbling, passing, and shooting. We make sure to sprinkle some fitness into all of our modified game activities - We want basketball to be thought of as FUN and something that can help improve our fitness!

MS: Basketball Skills - We are experiencing MARCH MADNESS in April. This past Monday, we began our Basketball Skills unit. We started by speaking on the importance of awareness when it comes to such a globally popular game as basketball. We acknowledge the importance of understanding basic level skills but also knowing a little bit about what is going on in the sport socially. We realize this can help us socially while realizing the economical impact such a popular game can play on society. We are implementing dribbling, passing, and shooting skills through small sided games and individual practice.

CLAY is the word of the month! Students have been getting their hands dirty by pinching, pulling, rolling, throwing, forming, scoring, joining and modeling ceramic clay for the past several weeks. Ceramics are starting to come out of their bisque firing in the kiln, ready for glazing or cold finishes.

- JK and K- Textured pinch pots and hand formed beads have been created.
- 1- Hand-built figural bells were constructed using slabs and modeling techniques.
- 2- Pinch pot bases support the creation of monsters, mice and men as students made creatures, giving special attention to attachment techniques and intentional texture.
- 3- Slabs are the base for many handbuilt ceramics both functional and sculptural.
   Textured bowls are drying in their slump molds and relief tiles are nearing completion.
- 4- Proper coil rolling techniques have been mastered, and students are using these ropes of clay to work independently. Bowls, cups, mermaids and hot dogs fill the shelves.
- 5- Students have had only 3 requirements for their clay work size (not too big or too small), intentional texture, and sturdy joining. Clay whistles have been popular, as well as coil built vessels - but the students have taken to this project with enthusiasm and the variety of work is extensive.
- Middle Schoolers Many students have now had the opportunity to use the potter's
  wheels this semester. It is one of my favorite skills to teach and I love that we have the
  opportunity to dip our toes into the world of pottery here at CCS.



And the winner of our mARTch Madness celebration of Art History is: Ansel Adams' The Tetons and the Snake River. Adams' striking photograph received more 8 votes in the championship round than our runner up - Vincent Van Gogh's Starry Night over the Rhone.



### Elementary school:

March has been the month of learning and reviewing topics such as colors and vocabulary related to spring. The students had fun doing a scavenger hunt in the forest area. They had to look for objects, animals, plants, among others, related to spring.

3-6 grade students watched the movie called "Pachama" in Spanish which shows the history of native people in South America. The objective of this movie was to show students about culture, understanding and listening to the Spanish language. The students also worked with the



song from the soundtrack of the movie in Spanish to identify vocabulary and grammar, such as identifying the verbs "ser" and "estar" = to be.

They also participated in "Pachamama Contest" In groups they had to answer questions related to this movie, based on character & animal description, comprehension questions about the movie in Spanish/English, discussion questions in Spanish/English & character identification. Questions about which stories in the movie are similar to some stories in the Bible.

They really enjoyed this activity and the two groups with the highest scores were awarded with a small treat.
