As we approach spring dress, we wanted to take a moment to remind everyone of a few uniform expectations. Shorts should not be tight, shirts should fit well enough that they may be tucked in, and jumpers/skirts should be no more than two inches from the knee. Additionally, uniforms should be clean, free of stains, holes, and fraying. A final word regarding uniforms is that students' hair should be neat, clean, and for our gentlemen, cut according to the uniform policy. Thank you so very much for adhering to these expectations. We recognize that during the two years of a pandemic it was important for us to provide some much needed grace. We now must return to our high expectations.
