### **Social Studies**

**This Week:** Students will learn facts on the Huang He River (Yellow River) and how the Chinese used characters and symbols in their written language. They will also begin learning about their inventions and how they were used in Ancient China.

**Next Week:** Students will learn about the contributions from Ancient Greece and how we use these contributions in modern times.

### Math

**This Week:** Students will learn how multiplication and division are related by understanding equal sharing. They will be introduced to the strategy of using models to group for division. Students will also begin learning basic multiplication facts of 0, 1, 2, and 5.

**Next Week:** Students will continue to learn how multiplication and division are related using a variety of strategies. They will also learn basic multiplication facts of 3, 4, and 6.

#### This Week:

We dove into our Poetry/Figurative Language Units this week, examining different features and types of each. With the help of a Figurative Language Flow Chart, students were able to ask the right types of questions to unlock hidden meanings and decipher language that needs to be "figured out."

#### This Week:

We completed our Lenten Journey (and began our celebration of the Triduum - Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday/Easter Vigil) this week by reading from our daily Devotional book, completing activities that highlight the promises that were made during this time (fasting, almsgiving, and prayer), walking/praying the Stations of the Cross, viewing 4th Grade's Passion Play, and making connections within our Christ In Us discussions and readings. We were also busy looking ahead and preparing for 3rd Grade's Mass coming up after the break.

Beginning on Thursday, May 1st we will pray the rosary weekly in honor of May being the month devoted to Mary. The rosary includes two prayers that may be less familiar to students (Fatima Prayer and Hail Holy Queen Prayer). The Fatima Prayer is said at the end of each decade of the rosary while the Hail Holy Queen is said upon completion of five decades of the rosary.

O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls to heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.

#### **Hail Holy Queen Prayer**

## Science

**This Week:** Students will learn how to measure mass using the metric system and the tools needed to measure different types of solids.
