Social Studies

We focused on science this week.

Math

This week we finished our unit on time. We practiced telling time to the hour and the half hour. We learned about how the clock has "clock rooms" when we are telling time to the half hour and that the hour hand will be in between two numbers not pointing directly at the number. Next week we will start our unit on data and graphing.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we focused on Poetry, specifically how an author's writing and word choice can connect with their readers and elicit emotions or feelings. We also continued to look at story elements (i.e., plot, setting, characters, problem, and solution) and review nonfiction text features as well.

<u>Grammar</u>

Our Grammar focus this week was also on poetry. We analyzed how poets use poetic devices (e.g., alliteration, rhyme, and repetition) as well as words that activate our 5 senses in order to create images in our heads. There will be no new Grammar skills next week. Instead, we will spend the time reviewing past skills.

Writing

There were several ways we wrote this week. We wrote about story elements (characters, setting, problem and solution, themes) found in our stories and texts. We also practiced Poetry devices/skills such as Alliteration, Repetition, and Rhyme by incorporating these patterns into our sentences. Additionally, we had many writing opportunities across content areas including sentence dictation, spelling, written responses in science and math, and addressing new vocabulary. Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing continued as well.

Theology

In Theology, we spent time in chapel learning about the life of St. Faustina Kowalska and the image of the Divine Mercy, as well as reciting a small portion of the divine mercy chaplet. In our classroom, we continued with our Theology of the Body curriculum and learned how our bodies and souls are a gift from God. We talked about how our bodies reveal our souls and how we must protect and take care of our precious bodies and souls.

Science

This week we learned about animal classifications and how we can put animals into categories

like warm- blooded or cold- blooded, reptiles, mammals, birds, fish, etc. We also started learning about animal adaptations.
