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Social Studies

This week in SS, students presented their Civil War timeline projects. Students were tasked with choosing what they believe to be the five most important events from the Civil War and defending their ideas. We used the Canva site to aid in the creation of the timelines. This was a very engaging activity that the students enjoyed!

We also began to study the Reconstruction era that took place after the Civil War. Next week, we will continue this unit. <u>The test for this chapter is currently scheduled for Thursday, April 25.</u>

Science

This week in Science we've continued Chapter 8-"Earth's Changing Surface." The kids enjoyed learning about volcanoes, earthquakes and the layers of the earth. We've been learning about fossils and the fossil record, and how that gives us a glimpse into the past in terms of the ways animals have evolved, and how specific areas have changed over time. Today we took our test over Ch. 8. Next week, we will begin Ch. 9 on the Water Cycle.

We are looking forward to our field trip on Monday, April 29th to the Science Museum of Virginia! Permission slips should be signed and returned no later than Monday, April 22nd. Our chaperones will be finalized and notified via email by April 26th.

Math

This week in Math we practiced word problems that incorporated our conversions of length, weight, and capacity in the metric and customary system, and learned how to calculate elapsed time. We also learned the formulas to find area and perimeter, and put these to use in word problems– finding the various missing dimensions of a given figure. We've enjoyed our lesson games correlating with topics in Unit 13 to help reinforce these skills.

Our Unit 13 Test is scheduled for Wednesday, May 1st

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in LA, we began our new novel Some Places More Than Others. This is a beautiful story about family and identity. Along with this novel study, students are also continuing to write essays about a variety of topics.

Next week, students will continue this work.

Theology

This week in Theology the kids have been working on their conversion stories, and our Unit 3 test was a great success. The kids also had their second VIRTUS lesson of the year. This lesson is designed to give them the tools they need to protect themselves if a difficult or dangerous situation were to arise, and to better inform them about what to do when someone intrudes upon or violates their boundaries. Next week we will begin Unit 4 Lesson 16- "What is Prayer?"
