Math

Data darlings! The Sloths and Cheetahs jumped right into our unit on data and graphing, learning key vocabulary and putting their analysis skills to the test reading tally charts and raw data charts, as well as interpreting data organized in bar, picture, and pictographs. They even had the opportunity to design their own surveys, record the collected data, and represent their findings with the graph of their choice. Talk about graphing gurus!

Religion

Alleluia! He is Risen! We're so happy to be back learning about the many blessings that God has given us. In a particular way, your little theologian has been studying intently the wonder and mystery of the Eucharist as many of our cheetahs and sloths prepare for their upcoming First Communion! They are confident to say that the Blessed Sacrament is indeed the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, Jesus Christ. They are familiar with the sights and sounds of the consecration, the most important part of the Mass, and can identify this Sacrament as how Jesus unites Himself fully with us and the Church.

Next week, we will continue our study of the Eucharist as we learn about how Jesus revealed Himself in the breaking of the bread in this Sunday Gospel story of the road to Emmaus. Then we will learn about the importance of the Sacred Vessels used in the Mass and how they are set for the liturgy. Finally, we will hear Brother Francis tell us more about this special Sacrament!

Science/Social Studies

Alien Attack is a hit! In this fictional economics game, each group is tasked with meeting the needs and wants of their civilization by bartering with neighboring civilizations or making purchases at the general store, all while navigating the whims of the evil dictator, Mrs. Robinson! Mwahaha (insert evil laugh here!)! Collaboration, creativity, and critical thinking! Ask your Cheetah or Sloth to explain how his/her group problem solved the stumbling blocks thrown their way, as well as how the group capitalized on good fortune to plan and prepare for the future of their civilization.

Much like in Alien Attack, the study of our precious Earth has taught the Sloths and Cheetahs how interdependent living systems are upon one another. We began this unit studying the impact of humans on the environment, as well as the importance of being stewards of and advocates for our Earth. Over the course of the next 5-6 weeks, our sweet scientists will study living systems in depth, completing a variety of hands-on activities and projects designed to bring joy to their learning, while also enhancing their understanding of the content!
