The VA Safari Park field trip is Monday, May 1. We appreciate all of our amazing chaperones! Please think carefully through your work and personal schedule before committing to chaperone. Only those registered as part of our group will be allowed on the Va Safari Park wagon. Parents who agree to take three or more students will not need to pay.

May 1: Please leave booster seats out front during morning drop off. We will plan to leave at 8:30. If you are driving students, please be in carline out front by 8:15. We will bring students out to you. We plan to return by 2:30. Students should wear comfortable closed toe shoes and blue/gold shirts. A hat is recommended. Please pack a snack and lunch for your child including a water bottle. Make sure your child eats a good breakfast. Please put sunscreen on your child before school. Once students arrive at the VA Safari Park, they will go to the bathroom and then follow the path to explore the walking/petting zoo. Feeding the birds is a lot of fun. Your child may wish to bring \$2 to buy a bird feed stick. The wagon will pull out at 11:30. Chaperones will take students to the bathroom and be at the wagon area at 11:15. Each student will be given a bucket of feed to feed the animals that come up to the wagon. The wagon ride will take about 45 minutes. Around 12:15, we will have lunch at the picnic tables located by the entrance. After lunch, chaperones will take students to the bathroom and load up cars for the return trip to school.
