As we approach the end of the school year, here are some key middle school dates:



6th: This week the 6th graders learned about World War I propaganda, and life on the home front. Next week they will learn about the sinking of the Lusitania and beginning of US involvement in the war.

7th: This week the 7th graders finished their unit on the 1980s and the fall of the Soviet Union. Next week they will take their 1970 to 1980s Test on Monday.

8th: This week the 8th graders learned about the Spanish exploration and wars in North and South America. Next week they will take their unit test on the age of exploration, Native American civilizations and the Conquistadors.

Math 6 (Garland): This past Friday, we quizzed on solving one step inequalities. This coming Monday, we will review for a unit test on equations and inequalities. I plan on

testing during Tuesday's class. For week's end, we will start a new unit entitled, "Geometry". Our initial focus will be on congruency.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): We finished up the Gala Project on Friday. Next week, we will start a new unit entitled, "Functions and Linear Relationships". Our initial focus will be on slope and how it helps show the relationships of coordinate points within a line.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we finished up the material associated with our unit entitled, "Area and Volume". I plan on testing this coming Monday and Tuesday. We will then get into a week-long student discovery project centered around Geometric Constructions. It will be due on Thursday, May 4th.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we started to solve and graph inequalities. We talked about the "mouth" and the "pinchy" sides of each inequality symbol and how we read all of those symbols from left to right (just like we read a word in English). We also talked about open versus closed dots and what direction the arrow goes for our solution. Please ask them to tell you the Spanish words/phrases for "open", "closed", "to the right" and "to the left". I always think about these lessons in Spanish because for so many years I taught students who spoke Spanish as their first language. Please ask the kids about it! Please also ask them to explain why the variable is so important to the direction of the arrow :) Next week, we will continue to solve more involved inequalities and graph their answers.

Algebra (Reid): This past week we finished up our unit on Simplifying Polynomials (adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing). The kids got a test review that will help them prepare for their next test. We are going to have our next test on Polynomials Operations on Thursday, April 27th. After our test, we will start to factor for much of the remainder of the year. We have simplified almost everything by getting rid of the parentheses, combining like terms and getting rid of negative exponents. Now, we will start to go the opposite direction by factoring which will take an expression that is completely simplified and try to put the parentheses back into the final answer :) It is the start of a very fun time!
