Social Studies

We focused on science this week.

Math

This week we started our unit on data and graphing. We learned how to gather and organize data in a number chart and on a tally chart. We also conducted surveys in the classroom and then worked on graphing the results. Next week we will continue to work on our graphing unit.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

<u>Reading</u>

This week we read several books about frogs in order to explore Author's Purpose (i.e., **P**ersuade, **I**nform, and **E**ntertain). We compared story structure and different fiction and nonfiction text structure and elements to determine the author's main purpose for writing. Next week we will read the book *Alligator and Crocodiles* as well other nonfiction related books as part of a research unit. We will be using reading comprehension strategies, examining nonfiction text structures, and practicing with synonyms and antonyms to determine facts and figure out hard words.

Grammar

This week we worked with contractions. These are words that are made by combining two words with an apostrophe such as don't (do not) and I'm (I am). Next week we will not be addressing a new grammar skill. Instead, we will be conducting research and completing a research project during class time on alligators and crocodiles.

Writing

This week we incorporated contractions into our writing as well as wrote about toads, frogs, and other aspects of the books that we read and discussed. There were also many more opportunities to write with sentence dictation, spelling, written responses in science and math, and addressing new vocabulary. Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing continued as well.

Theology

In Theology, we read the story of the Good Shepherd from the Bible and learned that Jesus not only forgives us when we sin, but actively seeks to reunite with us! We, also, discussed the importance of having rules, like the Ten Commandments, and how Jesus promises us certain blessings when we live according to God's will, called the Beatitudes. Then, we unpacked each Beatitude, what it means, and how we can practice it in our daily lives.

Science

This week we learned about habitats during our science time. We also started a habitat art and research project in which we will be researching a specific habitat and working with a group to illustrate that habitat. We have also been incubating 20 chicken eggs in the classroom and on Monday we had the opportunity to candle the eggs and see some chick development.

Please make sure that your child brings something warm and long sleeve to school each day (e.g., jacket, sweatshirt, sweater). We will continue to go outside and even though the temps get warm in the afternoon it is quite chilly in the morning.
