Announcements:

At CCS we honor Mary during May through the ceremony of May Crowning on May 2nd. A selected 8th grader adorns a statue of Mary with a flower crown, recalling that as the Bible tells us, she is the Queen of Heaven and Earth (Revelation 12). The rest of the school presents flowers to her in honor of the life she brought forth into the world through the Holy Spirit. At the beginning of Mass, all students will present flowers to Mary. **Each student is asked to bring in only one (1) long-stemmed flower that morning**. Please join us at Mass on Tuesday, May 2 at 8:15AM for this beautiful celebration.

We are anxiously awaiting the Spring Book Fair! The students love the book fair, and it is a wonderful CCS tradition. Unfortunately, this year we are struggling to secure parent volunteers to make this happen. Social Studies

This week we continued to learn about maps. We learned about continents and oceans. We labeled both and added them to our social studies interactive notebook. We then went on a map scavenger hunt where we tried to locate different items on a map of the United States and a map of the world.

Math

This week we continued counting mixed coins using our Hairy Money strategy. We also learned that 100 cents equals \$1 and practiced counting coins and seeing if we can exchange them for \$1. Next week we will introduce Financial Literacy as well as vocabulary such as allowance, income, cost, wants, needs, saving, spending, budget, and charity. As part of this unit we will review and practice counting money and solving money-related problems as well.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we read several books about frogs in order to explore Author's Purpose (i.e., **P**ersuade, **I**nform, and **E**ntertain). We compared story structure and different fiction and nonfiction text structure and elements to determine the author's main purpose for writing. Next week we will read the book *Alligator and Crocodiles* as well other nonfiction related books as part of a research unit. We will be using reading comprehension strategies, examining nonfiction text structures, and practicing with synonyms and antonyms to determine facts and figure out hard words.

<u>Grammar</u>

This week we worked with contractions. These are words that are made by combining two words with an apostrophe such as don't (do not) and I'm (I am). Next week we will not be addressing a new grammar skill. Instead, we will be conducting research and completing a research project during class time on alligators and crocodiles.

Writing

This week we incorporated contractions into our writing as well as wrote about toads, frogs, and other aspects of the books that we read and discussed. There were also many more opportunities to write with sentence dictation, spelling, written responses in science and math, and addressing new vocabulary. Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing continued as well

Religion

This week we finished learning about Jesus' Baptism. We completed comprehension questions, a story sort, and compared how Jesus and John were similar and different. Next week we will start learning about the Rosary. We will make a Rosary to use on Wednesday when we pray as a school. We will also participate in the May Crowning.

Science

This week we continued learning about different habitats.
