Science

This week students are learning how the earth rotates and revolves around the sun and how the sun's rays strike different parts of the earth, which causes our seasons.

Next week students will learn how the moon and earth interact, and will be introduced to the different phases of the moon.

Social Studies

This week students will be learning about the silk road and chinese numbers and characters.

Next week students will locate Ancient China on a map and learn about its contributions, such as written language and inventions. We will also be identifying the inventions of fireworks and kites.

Math

This week students learn strategies for multiplication by using arrays, repeated addition,tables, tree diagrams, and the commutative property of multiplication. They will review repeated subtraction and be introduced to division. Students should be practicing their multiplication up to five this week.

Next week we will continue to learn strategies and vocabulary for multiplication and division. We will work on multi-step word problems involving multiplication and division. Students will be bringing home vocabulary words for multiplication and division in their Friday Folders.

Holy week at CCS was filled with several highlights. We wrapped up our Lenten activities and had some important discussions around the final week of Lent, which includes the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday/Easter Vigil). We learned about the Last Supper where Jesus consecrated the Eucharist and taught us about service and humility (i.e., the washing of feet). We also walked the stations of the cross, outside, and had a lot of important conversations about his passion and the sacrifice he made for us. We concluded the week with our Passion Play, put on by the 4th grade. It was a great presentation and an exciting preview for our 3rd graders.

While Easter may be over when we return to school on Monday, April 17, we will still be in the Easter Season, which runs from April 9 (Easter) to May 28 (Pentecost).
