Announcements:

Social Studies

We learned about United States symbols during our social studies time. We gained background knowledge on the American Flag, the bald eagle, the White House, and the Liberty Bell just to name a few. We then took an interactive field trip around Washington D.C. and created posters of our favorite symbol.

Math

This week we continued our unit on graphing and data. We learned about vertical and horizontal bar graphs and practiced reading, creating, and answering questions based on the data. Next week we will finish our unit with a cumulative project in which we will create a question, survey the class to collect data and construct different graphs and questions based

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

<u>Reading</u>

This week we read the book *Alligator and Crocodiles* as well other nonfiction related books as part of a research unit. We used reading comprehension strategies, examined nonfiction text structures, and practiced with synonyms and antonyms to determine facts and figure out hard words. Next week we will read the book, *Jabari Jumps*, and practice synthesizing, or putting together all of the information that we will learn and/or acquire throughout the reading and discussions.

<u>Grammar</u>

This week we did not address a new grammar skill. Instead, we conducted research and completed a research project during class time on alligators and crocodiles. Next week we will practice with possessive nouns (Jabari's bike = the bike that belongs to Jabari) and differentiate between plural nouns (bikes).

Writing

This week we wrote about alligators and crocodiles for our research projects as well as other aspects of the books that we read and discussed (e.g., new reading strategies that were introduced). There were also many more opportunities to write with sentence dictation, spelling, written responses in science and math, and addressing new vocabulary. Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing continued as well.

Theology

In Theology, we continued our celebration of the month of our Blessed Mother by writing acrostic poems to honor her and completing a collaborative poster of the Hail Mary. We, also, completed our unit on God's laws and mercy, which included a study of the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, sin and forgiveness, and the story of the Good Shepherd.

Science

This week we watched in awe as our chicks hatched out of the eggs we have been incubating for the past 21 days. We welcomed 8 chicks on Monday and Tuesday. We got to see them hatch in the incubator and got to pet them when they were moved once they dried.
