MEDICATION PICK UP AND PLANNING FOR NEXT YEAR If you have provided medication to the nurse's office for this school year, it MUST be picked up on the last day of school for your student. Any medications left in the clinic will be disposed of by 6/10/2023. In preparing for next school year, an UPDATED medication authorization form and medical condition action plan MUST be provided to the school nurse on or before the first day of school. Action Plans and Medication Authorization Forms are located in FACTS under resource documents. If your student is eligible for "self-carry", it must be indicated on the forms by a licensed medical provider. Remember, per Diocesan Policy, no medication, prescription or over the counter, can be dispensed to your student without authorization from a parent AND licensed medical provider.

Theology

We drew our family including God, themselves, the Holy Spirit, Mary our Mother, Father David and our siblings. Our kindergarteners read and discussed the book An Egg Is Quiet.

Science
