## First Grade

### **Announcements:**

Spring Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) testing will take place during the weeks of May 15th and 22nd. All testing will begin at 8:15AM. In order for us to gather accurate data on your child's progress, it is vital that students arrive at school on time, rested, and fed. Please do not schedule appointments for your child that may interfere with their testing time. While make-ups are available, students tend to not perform as well when they are not in the full session with their classmates. We appreciate your help with this. Data collected helps us make informative instructional decisions.

### **Social Studies**

We will focus on social studies during our math time by learning about needs and wants, goods and services, and spending vs saving.

### Math

This week we worked on reviewing math concepts that we have learned this year. Next week we will introduce Financial Literacy as well as vocabulary such as allowance, income, cost, wants, needs, saving, spending, budget, and charity.

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

#### Reading

This week we continued to read several books about frogs in order to explore Author's Purpose (i.e., **P**ersuade, **I**nform, and **E**ntertain). We compared story structure and different fiction and nonfiction text structure and elements to determine the author's main purpose for writing. Next week we will read the book *Alligator and Crocodiles* as well other nonfiction related books as part of a research unit. We will be using reading comprehension strategies, examining nonfiction text structures, and practicing with synonyms and antonyms to determine facts and figure out hard words.

#### <u>Grammar</u>

This week we worked on reviewing grammar concepts that we have learned so far this year. Next week we will not be addressing a new grammar skill. Instead, we will continue conducting research and completing a research project during class time on alligators and crocodiles.

#### **Writing**

This week we incorporated contractions into our writing as well as wrote about toads, frogs, and other aspects of the books that we read and discussed. There were also many more opportunities to write with sentence dictation, spelling, written responses in science and math, and addressing new vocabulary. Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing continued as well

## Religion

This week we continued working on the Rosary. We also made a May Crowning craft to display in the hallway. We met with our Faith Buddies during our Mass time and made Mother's Day cards as well as had time to play together on the playground. Next week we will participate in the Wednesday Rosary as well as learn about the 10 commandments.

### Science

This week we completed a habitat project. The glass was broken up into 4 groups: The Woodlands, The Ocean, The Rainforest, and The Desert. As a group they were given a large piece of paper and an I-pad. They then used the Epic! App to research their habitat and make their paper into their assigned habitat.
