Math

This week we continued working on converting customary and metric units. Next week we will focus on metric measurement and reviewing for the end of the year math placement test (test is on 5/20).

Science

This week we worked with reading graphic organizers, graphing and interpreting charts, and creating our own charts and graphs based on our own data. Next week we will apply our

knowledge of graphs and charts to complete a fun project.

Social Studies

This week we reviewed the Industrial Revolution and were scheduled to have a test today that has been moved to **Wednesday, May 18th.** Next week we will cover the era that led to the Civil War. This will be our final unit of study for the year. Next week we will also focus on labeling the entire map with States and Capitals.

Language Arts

This week we finished reading *The Phantom Tollbooth*, and students took a test on the novel. They also turned in the Dodecahedron Project. Next week, we will read two short stories from the *Journeys* anthology and will receive a new set of spelling/vocabulary words from one of the stories. We have also been working on defining words in context, and there will be a test on that material next Thursday.
