JK-7th Grade Field Day is quickly approaching! On Friday, May 23, Ms. Varney will need 40-50 volunteers to make this event special for the kids. #### Field Day Information

Field Day for JK-7th grade is Friday, May 23. It is an 11:30AM dismissal day for students - JK Extended Day and STEAM Aftercare will both be in session.

Please read the following information carefully and ensure that your children come to school fully prepared.

All essential items needed this day (with a few rules):

- Bathing suits are not required; if worn, they must be covered by shorts and a t-shirt at all times. Students must be able to independently remove their bathing suits and put them back on to use the restroom. Swim trunks are fine but t-shirts are to remain on.
- Appropriate closed-toed shoes; sneakers are preferred (NO Crocs, flip flops, or sandals)
- Sunscreen, sunscreen! Sunscreen MUST be applied at home, as we cannot apply it to students at school
- Comfortable loose fitting athletic attire that meets dress code requirements
- A FULL change of clothes (including socks) should be brought to school in a PLASTIC BAG so that students can use the bag to carry wet clothing home
- Hats are acceptable on this day as they provide sun blockage
- No sunglasses (unless prescription)
- LABELED Water Bottle (it is very important that we stay hydrated on this day)
- Towel

In the event that it rains on May 23, Field Day will be canceled and we will have a normal school day (the 11:30AM dismissal will remain); students will need to wear their regular uniforms. You will receive notification from Mrs. Fallica on Thursday night/Friday morning if the decision to cancel needs to be made.

# Social Studies

This week we began talking about American Symbols. We learned what a symbol is, made a folder to collect our learning and learned about the American Flag, the Star Spangled Banner, and the Pledge of Allegiance. Next week we will continue with some more symbols.

## Math

This week we started our unit on time. We learned about how many hours are in a day, how to use a calendar, we sorted things that we do in the AM and PM and learned about the clock parts. We also reviewed telling time to the hour. Next week we will continue our unit on time.

# Language Arts/Reading/Writing

#### <u>Reading</u>

This week we read the book, *Jabari Jumps*, and practiced synthesizing, or putting together all of the information that we learned and/or acquired throughout the readings and discussions. We discussed how using information that we may already have about a topic can help us to make connections to a text that we are reading. We then inferred, gathered additional information as we read, watched characters change, and ultimately synthesized and put everything together. As we followed this process we found our own thinking changed as new details emerged and became clearer.

#### <u>Grammar</u>

This week we practiced with possessive nouns (Jabari's bike = the bike that belongs to Jabari) and differentiated between plural nouns (bikes).

#### <u>Writing</u>

This week we wrote in conjunction with our reading skill of the week, synthesizing. After reading our main book as well as other texts, we synthesized our thoughts and wrote about characters in stories and details found in nonfiction readers. We also incorporated possessive nouns into our writing as we completed graphic organizers and various writing activities that asked us to "Put it all together." There were also many more opportunities to write with sentence dictation, spelling, written responses in science and math, and addressing new vocabulary. Writing activities in our Daily 5 rotations such as journal/story writing continued as well.

# Theology

This week we wrapped up our unit on prayer by talking about the Glory Be prayer and how it is a prayer to the Holy Trinity. We, also, took an assessment on our prayer unit using pages from our Christ in Us textbooks.
