## Science/Social Studies

This week was our last week of Science instruction! We went out with a bang, learning all about habitats (arctic, desert, rainforest, forest, grasslands, freshwater, and oceans) and how plants and animals are uniquely adapted to survive in their habitat. The Hawks also investigated how our human impact on the Earth is a danger to living and nonliving things, and can even lead to some species becoming endangered or extinct.

As part of our reading rotations, the Hawks read nonfiction pieces connected to topics in this science unit, investigating author's purpose, identifying main idea, and answering both explicit and implicit comprehension questions.

Next week, we'll apply everything we've learned about animals, plants, and ecosystems to create a new species, identify its habit, and list its unique adaptations. I'm excited to see the Hawks' imagination and creativity merge with science!

## Math

Fabulous Fractions and super symmetry!! The Hawks learned about fractions as equal parts of wholes and sets, with a focus on halves, thirds, fourths, sixths, and eighths; check folders for graded tests. This was the FINAL unit in second grade. Next up, these terrific test-takers will flex their math muscles on the MAP standardized test on May 20 and on an End-Of-Year Assessment (paper/pencil test which will include questions from each unit covered in second grade) on Wednesday, May 22. We'll close out the year challenging ourselves with third grade content and hands-on projects.

It is important our kids know this theme for the day, please alert them. Fun = a good time spent with our peers away from the classroom. Friends = celebrating the relationships we've made this year and enjoying them. #### Dear Parents,

We are so excited to be offering this again and can't wait to see all the students and volunteers. Please read ahead to get a quick note on what is required of your students on field day. All other notes regarding field day activities and movement patterns will be answered and addressed by reviewing the remaining parts of your packet. Please read ALL THE WAY THROUGH. All activities this day will involve lots of movement and lots of water. Given the duration of the day, it is extremely important to have a few items accompanied by each student. Please see the list below. I do though need to stress that students must have a labeled water bottle.

All essential items needed this day (with a few rules):

- Bathing suits are not required If worn, they must be covered by shorts and a tee shirt at all times. Swim trunks are fine but shirt tops are to remain on.
- Appropriate closed-toed shoes sneakers are preferred (no Crocs, flip flops, or sandals)
- Sunscreen, Sunscreen, and Sunscreen (<u>sunscreen MUST be applied at home, as we cannot apply it to students at school</u>)
- Comfortable loose fitting athletic attire that meets dress code requirements
- A change of clothes, FULL set of clothes, and change of shoes, socks too!
- Hats are acceptable on this day as they provide sun blockage
- No sunglasses (Unless prescription)
- LABELED Water Bottle (super important we stay hydrated on this day.)
- Towel (1 should be ok, as heat should dry towels quickly)
- Snack

The field day time frame is 8:30 - 11:00 am. We will have 15 groups rotating through 12 stations (roughly 12 minutes a station.) As the primary field day activities conclude, the schedule will allow for changing time, cleaning time, and pack up time to be dismissed by 11:30. This means that all classes will go back to their classrooms to cool off, snack if necessary, and prepare to go home for the long weekend. (no school lunch/HALF DAY)

It will be a fun day your students won't soon forget, so be sure to rest up Thursday night!!! Thank you so much for your help ensuring your students have what they need on this day. We are looking forward to a wonderful day!
