### Science

**This week** students will learn how the moon and earth interact, and will be introduced to the different phases of the moon and the lunar and solar eclipse. We will begin working on our vocabulary foldable booklet.

**Next week** students will learn the order of planets in the solar system and be introduced to other bodies that make up our universe. We will begin working on our Solar System project.

## **Social Studies**

**This week** students will learn how they adapted to their environment and the resources used to produce goods and services. They will identify Ancient Greece on a map and explain how it has changed over time.

**Next week** students will learn about the contributions of ancient Rome. We will cover architecture, government, arts, and environment. Please read the Parent Letter in their Friday Folder.

**This week** students will learn how fractions are part of a set. They will also be introduced to fractions using a number line, and equivalent fractions.
