Social Studies

This Week: Students will be introduced to the contributions from Ancient Greece and how we use these contributions in modern times.

Next Week: Students will learn about their types of architecture, arts, and sports as well as their government. They will also be introduced to what life was like in Ancient Greece and how it has changed over time.

This Week: Students will continue to learn how multiplication and division are related using a variety of strategies. They will be introduced to the concept of inverse operations.

This Week:

We continued with our Poetry/Figurative Language Units this week, examining different features and types of each. With the help of a Figurative Language Flow Chart, students were able to ask the right types of questions to unlock hidden meanings and decipher language that needs to be "figured out." Students also began writing poetry. A few types that we are working on are Limericks, Haikus, Acrostics, Cinquains, Alliterations, Diamantes, and I Am poems.

Beginning on Thursday, May 1st we will pray the rosary weekly in honor of May being the month devoted to Mary. The rosary includes two prayers that may be less familiar to students (Fatima Prayer and Hail Holy Queen Prayer). The Fatima Prayer is said at the end of each decade of the rosary while the Hail Holy Queen is said upon completion of five decades of the rosary.
