Math

Ms. Wawner's class learned about subtraction this week. We practiced reading subtraction sentences and using manipulatives to solve equations. We practiced building and taking away with unifix cubes, as well as making play-doh balls and smashing them. We will continue exploring subtraction next week.

Ms. Shank's class began our unit on subtraction. We are using manipulatives to practice subtracting. We will also be reviewing units that we have learned throughout the year.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ms. Wawner's class started our ABC countdown this week. Students enjoyed sharing their stuffed animals, creating bubble solution and wands, creating chalk art, having a dance party, and doing some easy experiments. We also learned the elements of a story and listened to a few read alouds that have strong characters, settings, problems, and solutions. We will create a story together and hopefully students will create their own short story in the coming weeks.

Ms. Shank's class continued reviewing sight words as we prepare for kindergarten. We read books highlighting the words *my and is*. We focused on the letter Z. Next week we will begin discriminating between letters. We made zebras for our letter book. We have been practicing reading sentences with our sight words. We continued our author study of Eric Carle that fits with our study of insects. We read "The Very Hungry Caterpillar", "The Very Grouchy Ladybug", "The Very Clumsy Click Beetle", We talked about how he created his illustrations and next week we will all become Eric Carles and create our own art project using his technique.

Theology/SEL

Ms. Wawner's class talked about how Catholics honor Mary in May and how we can honor her this month. Next week, We will start talking about Fruits of the Spirit.

Ms. Shank's class studied our Holy Mother Mary. We learned about the significant events of her life. We also talked about the rosary being a holy object and practiced how to hold the rosary and count the beads. We began saying the rosary outside with the school. We will continue to say the rosary every Thursday outside after the morning bell. Please feel free to join us.

Science and Social Studies

Ms. Wawner's class is juggling lots of things in Science these days! We have large sprouts on our mammoth sunflowers that we planted before break. We take time to water and observe them each day. We continue to work with Mr. Bruscia's class to see if plants grow better outside in soil or inside by hydroponics. This Tuesday, we saw how our snap peas, radishes, strawberries and lettuce have thrived indoors. Next week, we will transfer some to our outside garden beds to see how they do there. Finally, we started a unit on insects this week. We will continue studying insects for the next couple of weeks.

Ms. Shank's class started our large unit on insects and life cycles. We received our caterpillars and our ladybug larva. The students were fascinated. We created a diagram of the butterfly life cycle. We also learned about bees and the different jobs that each bee performs and how they make honey. We will learn about ants and ladybugs next week. With our study the students are learning how important insects are and the part they play in the food web.
