Hello again, parents!

Time has flown again this month, and it's hard to believe there are only a few music classes remaining before summer! As a whole, all grades continue to learn new songs for mass each week. This past month in particular I have been blown away by the entire student body's exuberant and willing music participation at mass.

<u>Pre-K/Kindergarten/1st/2nd*</u>: This past month, the students have continued to have music spotlights, which are meant to highlight influential musicians across many genres of music. This month, we included Whitney Houston, Verna Felton, Scatman Crothers, and Phil Collins. Through fun facts and listening, we enjoyed learning about his/her music contributions. In addition, the students have been working hard to memorize and learn music to sing for a small music presentation to give their Grandparents and Great Friends (next Friday 5/9). Mrs. Lewis and myself have been impressed with these grades' engagement and dedication to learning and singing!

*2nd Grade has also worked on a music and art collaboration project with Mrs. Devlin

and myself: making rainsticks. My dad and his best friend built each student a two foot PVC pipe rainstick with stoppers to trap the falling beads and emulate a rain sound. The rainsticks teach the students about traveling sound and sound mimicry. They are in the process of decorating these rainsticks with Mrs. Devlin, and their creativity is astonishing!! The rainsticks will be used during the music presentation for Grandparent and Great Friends day.

3rd-5th Grade**: This past month, the students have continued to have music spotlights, which intend to highlight influential musicians across many genres of music. This month, we included Whitney Houston, Aretha Franklin, and Elvis Presley. Through fun facts and listening, we enjoyed learning about why and how each of these people are labeled as some of the most iconic musicians in history of late. In addition, the students have been working hard to memorize and learn music to sing for a music presentation for their Grandparents and Great Friends (next Friday 5/9). I am super impressed with their memorization skills and genuine hard work!

**4th grade: The 4th grade had a bit less regular class time, as they were busy rehearsing for the Passion Play during their scheduled music time. They truly poured their hearts into telling the story of Jesus' death and resurrection, and I was so impressed with their dedication, musicality and reverence throughout the entire rehearsal process. Bravo!!

<u>Middle School</u>: This past month, middle school has continued their studies with note/rest values through mathematical applications. Currently, middle school is working to complete their final assignment in music this semester (still cannot believe it's May!!). This final assignment is a mini research presentation on an influential musician/artist of their choosing. The students will have one more week to research and formulate their presentations in class, and they will present to their class the following week. In addition to researching this musician's life and musical contributions/significance, they must also analyze one song by their chosen artist, using tools and vocabulary we learned in previous classes. I am looking forward to watching their presentations and gaining a deeper understanding as to whom they deem as the most influential musicians in their lives.

During the month of May, elementary students learned about how Holy Week is celebrated in Latin America, especially in Guatemala. They also completed their food-related lessons and began learning the topic "At the Restaurant," which includes how to order in a restaurant using the verbs "gustar=to like," "querer=to want," and "desear=to wish ." They also learned about clothing, verbs "vestir=to dress" and "llevar puesto=to wear." As usual, they participated in

written activities, games, reading, and oral activities. This month, they will learn about transportation, the city, and the countryside, and sea animals.

Most elementary classes just have 2 (or less) SEL lessons left for the entire school year! Here is how we are wrapping up:

JK - We will continue to practice solving problems in a variety of ways. Most recently, students practiced turn-taking with physical materials, but we will also be explicitly practicing turn-taking with ideas and verbal conversations.

K – Kindergarten students are continuing to practice positive relationship-building skills. They have completed lessons related to active listening and offering compliments to each other. During our final month of lessons, kindergarten students will explore how they can help to repair a friendship when a mistake or unhelpful choice is made.

1st grade – First graders are exploring the connection between personal actions and consequences. This month, first grade will strengthen this understanding by assessing various age-appropriate social "problems" and generating better solutions

2nd grade – Second graders will finish the year by explicitly practicing certain conflict resolution skills (i.e using "I" statements and apologizing). These have been modeled and practiced at various points during the school year in small groups, but this will be the first time it is practiced as a whole group.

3rd grade – Third graders will continue to explore elements of a healthy friendship until the end of the school year. Students will continue to practice how they can contribute to healthy friendships within the school setting and end the year with a reflection on how they can care for their own friendships in a healthy manner.

4th grade – Fourth grade is continuing their deep dive into conflict resolution and will finish the year with explicit practice of conflict resolution strategies. These concepts will be reviewed during the first SEL lessons in the fall for immediate carryover into the next grade level.

5th grade – Fifth grade has spent several sessions learning new coping strategies and putting them into practice. Our final SEL session will be spent sorting helpful vs. unhelpful thoughts and how speaking to ourselves in certain ways can help us cope.
