Science

This week students will learn the order of planets in the solar system and be introduced to other bodies that make up our universe. We will begin working on our Solar System project.

Next week students will present their project on our solar system to the class. We will complete our vocabulary activity.

This Week:

Reading

This Week: Students shared/presented their Book Fair Reports (Google Slides Presentations). We also introduced our unit on Poetry, read several different types of poems, examined various poetic devices used to create rhythm, establish mood, and enhance the overall meaning of the poem, and finally, learned about figurative language and other techniques used in poetry such as similes, metaphors, idioms, personification, alliteration, and imagery.

Next Week: We will dive deeper into Poetry, analyzing the creative and structural choices an author makes within their poem, and discuss how those decisions affect the overall presentation and one's ability to make a personal connection (i.e., feelings, emotions, and/or personal experiences) to the poem.

This Week:

May is Mary's month, which marks a new spiritual season, representing the beginning of new life! This week we continued to recognize Mary by praying the Rosary, learning more about her through the Hail, Holy Queen prayer, and honoring her further with special devotions and activities. We also recognized the feast of Our Lady of Fatima (May 13) and discussed the additional Marian Apparitions that would occur over the next several months, culminating with the Miracle of the Sun (October 13).

Next Week:

We will continue to learn about and honor Mary next week with activities based around the feast day of Our Lady of Fatima, Mary's Three Secrets, and the Miracle of the Sun. We will also attend our final school-wide mass on Tuesday, as well as pray our final decade of the Rosary on Wednesday. Sunday, May 28, also marks the last day of the Easter Season (Pentecost), which will be discussed next week as well. Pentecost commemorates the descending of the Holy Spirit onto the disciples and the beginning of the church.
