Math 6 (Garland): This past week, we finished up visualizing Statistics with Dot/Stem and Leaf Plots. The students will have their final quiz on May 30th. We will spend the remainder of the week preparing for their final exams, which start on June 5th.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): 8th grade prepared for the Pre-Algebra Exam this past week. They will take their exam on Tuesday and be done with the course. The kids have done a phenomenal job this year and I couldn't be prouder! 6th and 7th grade will finalize the mini unit on Geometry and will have a quiz on May 30th. Algebra (Reid): This past week, the 8th graders wrapped up new material, handed in their exam review, and had their 4th quarter binder check.
