- Monday, May 15 and Thursday, May 18 MAP Testing Spring Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) testing will take place on Monday (Reading) and Thursday (Math). All testing will begin at 8:15AM. In order for us to gather accurate data on your child's progress, it is vital that students arrive at school on time, rested, and fed. Please do not schedule appointments for your child that may interfere with their testing time. While make-ups are available, students tend to not perform as well when they are not in the full session with their classmates. We appreciate your help with this. Data collected helps us make informative instructional decisions.

• Monticello Guidelines:

• Bags and Backpacks. None exceeding $12 \times 6 \times 12$ inches are allowed beyond the Shuttle Station. New security bag check stations are a good reason to ensure all prohibited items are left at home or on the bus.

• In the House. Eating, drinking, chewing gum and using tobacco products are prohibited. Still photography, filming, and video recording for anything other than personal use are prohibited. Guests are urged not to touch or lean on walls or furnishings.

• On the Grounds. The West Lawn is open to guests; otherwise guests are asked to remain on designated paths and trails. Smoking is not permitted near the house or its dependencies and terraces.

• Photography: Still photography, filming and video recording for personal use are permitted.

• Monticello is a tobacco-free and eCigarette-free site.

Science

This week students will learn how the moon and earth interact, and will be introduced to the different phases of the moon.

Next week students will learn the order of planets in the solar system and be introduced to other bodies that make up our universe.

Social Studies

This week students will be introduced to Life in Ancient Greece and learn about their contributions beginning with architecture.

Next week students will learn about the contributions of art and sports in Ancient Greece, and will be introduced to direct democracy. We will begin to work on our vocabulary foldable for our unit on Ancient Greece.

Math

This week students learned strategies to use to work on multi-step word problems involving multiplication and division. We will review how fractions can be used to represent numbers and their parts.

 Students should be practicing their multiplication and division tables up to ten using the Math Trainer website.

Next week students will learn how fractions are part of a set. They will be introduced to equivalent fractions using a number line.

-Students began working on their Book Fair Reports, which will be completed by using Google Slides. Students can access their Reports on any device, school or at home, with their school email account. Therefore, if they would like to work on their Report at home, they can. Please just be aware of how much "help" you are providing to them. Since Google Slides is going to be new for most students, I will continue to support them quite a bit in regard to the technical elements of the platform (e.g., helping change fonts, adjusting sizing, inserting pics, etc...). However, the bulk of the content, creative ideas, and writing/typing really needs to come from them. I'm really excited to see what they all come up with. There has been a lot of enthusiasm already and a willingness to dive in and explore.

Next Week: Book Fair Reports (Google Slides Presentations) are due by **Friday, 5/12**. When finished, students will select the Share feature (top right hand corner within Slides), type in my email address (<u>t.little@cvillecatholic.org</u>), and then hit Done.

Virtus Protecting God's Children: Teaching Safety - Lesson 2 - Through this lesson we will build upon the foundation of Lesson 1 (back in October) and assist students in learning how to respect themselves and others. After Lesson 2, children should be better able to respect their own health and safety and the safety of others, by understanding the difference between safe and unsafe individuals, as well as safe and unsafe touches. They will also learn to stand up for themselves and others more effectively by responding in an appropriate manner to unsafe situations involving themselves or their friends.
