## Reading

**This Week:** We dove deeper into Poetry, analyzing the creative and structural choices an author makes within their poem, and discussed how those decisions affect the overall presentation and one's ability to make a personal connection (i.e., feelings, emotions, and/or personal experiences) to the poem. We also learned that poetry often consists of figurative language that requires the reader to "figure out" its hidden, complex, or confusing meanings compared to something that is stated with a more literal and obvious description.
