It has been such a joy to teach your children this year! This year fifth, fourth and third graders learned how to have a simple conversation in Spanish, how to discuss the weather, how to say the date, how to express how they are feeling, how to describe themselves and family members, vocabulary for rooms and items in a house and for school supplies, vocabulary for animals and are able to identify them based on a short description, and they learned about different holidays, music, food and other important aspects of hispanic culture.

In sixth grade students took what they learned last year in fifth grade and worked on improving their grammar. We learned how to write simple sentences, the verbs ser and estar and their differences and how to conjugate verbs in order to speak in the first, second or third person.

I have had a blast teaching some of my students for two years in a row and will miss them all greatly next year. My husband and I are moving to Richmond but I will always remember CCS and the wonderful community here.
