Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation.

Students in 5th grade will be tested on all US states and their capitals. The states will be chunked by region for learning and mastery. A great way to study the states is found on a free game learning website:

Math

This week we investigated how math is used in our daily lives. We will begin working with place value from the thousandths to the millions.

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (<u>khanacademy.org</u>). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 1st qtr. requirements, due before the end of the quarter are Decimal Place Value, Add Decimals and Subtract Decimals.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

We had a great week this week discussing the summer reading book and working on some fun activities associated with it. We did a virtual field trip of The Metropolitan Museum of Art and completed a scavenger hunt of the museum. We also became more familiar with Google Classroom and the ways in which we will use it this year. Next week we will complete our activities on the book by working in groups to write a script and perform a favorite scene from the book. We will also be administering the spelling inventory and taking the MAP reading assessment.

Theology

This week we introduced some of the key vocabulary that will be covered in theology this year by playing a basketball game with the terms. We also reviewed the six prayers we say daily at CCS, and students must recite all six by next Friday for a quiz grade. I will work with the new students to provide an extension of this deadline to see when they are ready to take those quizzes, because they are less familiar with these prayers. Next week, we will begin our unit on the parts of the Mass and the ways in which we participate in the Mass. We will also have our first Mass of the year on Tuesday, and students must be in formal dress.

Science

In science we reviewed lab safety. We will be reviewing the scientific method next week.
