6th: This week the 6th graders learned about the basic concepts for understanding history such as culture, politics, economics, and geography. Next week we will begin exploring the state of the United States in the early 1850s.

7th: This week the 7th graders learned about the basic concepts for understanding history such as culture, politics, economics, and geography. Next week we will begin exploring the state of the world in the 1920s.



8th: This week the 8th graders learned about Maslow's Hierarchy of Need as a framework for understanding human behavior in ancient times. Next week we will be exploring the paleolithic era and the origins of humankind.

Math 6 (Garland): Welcome back parents and students. This past week, we pre assessed skills to see where the students were with ability. Next week, we are going to start Unit 1 by discussing exponents(as a means to represent repeated multiplication). My plan is to quiz students on the perfect squares of numbers 1 - 20 on Friday, September 1st. This is an assessment on the ability to quickly recall number facts.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): Welcome back parents and students. This past week, we pre assessed skills to see where the students were with ability. Next week, we will start Unit 1 by getting into Absolute Value and Fraction Operations. We will use a quick review of adding and subtracting fractions to get into their related calculations of multiplication and division.

Geometry (Garland): Welcome back parents and students. This past week, we pre assessed skills to see where the students were with ability and introduced pattern observation through the lenses of deductive and inductive reasoning. We also explored the concept of debunking patterns with a counterexample. Next week, we will get into the principles of Logic. I will assign a Logic Project on September 1st which will be due on September 12th.

Math 7 (Reid): Welcome to a great school year! I am so excited to be a part of the CCS Family. Thank you to all of you and your warm welcome as we start this new school year. This past week we did some fun math logic work to see where kids problem solving skills are at as we prepare to take the MAP assessment next week. Next week in addition to MAP testing, we will start to work with exponents and develop the ideas of perfect squares and perfect cubes.

Algebra (Reid): Welcome to a great school year! I am so excited to be a part of the CCS Family. Thank you to all of you and your warm welcome as we start this new school year. This past week we challenged ourselves with the "Four Fours" activity. Lots of great thinking and questions which are leading us into our study of expressions and how to simplify, evaluate and translate expressions from words into symbols so we can better communicate in the language of math (a.k.a Algebra).

6th Grade Composition (Kerrigan): Welcome to middle-school language arts! I am so excited to be joining the CCS faculty this year. This week, our 6th graders practiced many policies and procedures which will allow us to have an efficient, productive year in both English Composition and Literature. We also pre-assessed grammar skills and did our first in-class writing prompt which we shared aloud within small groups. Next week, we will complete our first vocabulary lesson from our *Vocabulary Power Plus* workbook, with a scheduled quiz on Friday, Sept. 2. We will also start out grammar with a review of all the 8 parts of speech. Pop quizzes are also not out of the realm of possibility!

6th Grade Literature (Kerrigan): This week, we spent time learning how to be organized middle-school students, assembling our Literature/Composition binders, navigating Google Classroom, and practicing our classroom routines. Next week, we will be finishing up a creative classroom assignment on our second summer reading book choice and beginning our literature content with story elements and short stories. Welcome back! I hope you all had a wonderful summer and are excited for the new school year. It has been so great to have students back in class and I am having such a great time getting to know these wonderful 7th and 8th grade students! If you have students in both grades you'll notice they are learning the same material this year. This year both 7th and 8th grade are taking Spanish I, but next year 7th grade will take Spanish I and 8th grade will take Spanish II.

So far in Spanish we have gotten to know each other better, we talked about class rules and procedures, we learned basic classroom commands and materials though a classroom scavenger hunt, and we talked about the use of a translator. This is noted in my syllabus, but I wanted to put it here too that **the use of a translator is prohibited in Spanish.** It will be counted as cheating if a student uses a translator to complete their work and they will receive a 0% for that assignment. If a student does not know a word they are trying to use they should:

- 1. Look at the class notes in their binder or on Google classroom
- 2. Try to use another word/words that they do know
- 3. Ask me or another Spanish speaker
- 4. Look on Word reference.com

As we discussed in class, a translator often gives incorrect translations and it is very easy to tell if one was used. Above all else, using a translator will not help a student learn the language and think on their own. Mistakes are proof that the student is trying and I am not expecting them to be perfect, but I do expect each student to complete their own work.
