Social Studies

This Week: Students will learn about parts of a map and identify the seven continents on a map.

Next Week: Students will identify and explain the parts of a map and locate and label the seven continents on a world map.

Math

This Week: Students are learning to identify the presidents and values on the half dollar, quarters, dimes, nickels, and penny. They are learning to count on using a variety of coins to make a dollar. They will record the money earned this week in their math journals and agenda on Friday.

 Math homework will begin on Tuesday, September 3rd. They will have Tuesday night homework and Wednesday night math homework. Please check your child's agendon Tuesday.

Next Week: Students are learning place values up to the hundreds. They will explain and demonstrate their strategies using place value blocks. They will write three digit numbers in three forms- standard method, expanded method and word form.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This Week:

We completed our first Word Study Unit and Mentor Sentence of the year. We learned about the relationship between adjectives and nouns and how to identify a subject (the main who or what of a sentence) and a predicate (the action or description of the subject and how it must have a verb). We also completed reading lessons which focused on identifying only the most important parts of a text in order to summarize, while also using the title to help make important connections to the text and to tie things together.

Next Week:

Typically during a "Short Week" we will not have a new Word Study or Mentor Sentence. We will continue to review and practice skills though.
