In the first quarter, K-1st graders will learn about book care, parts of a book and how to find their way around the library. They will be checking books out to bring home. We ask that the books "live" in their backpack, so that they are ready for their next library class and safe from little hands and hungry pets. Second-Fifth graders will be given reading levels after the MAS testing. This will guide them to the best books for their individual reading level. Welcome back all students and families - I am thrilled to be back for my 4th year at CCS and to have another opportunity to work with your children! Please see a brief synopsis below of how we have began our year:

K-2: Introducing boundaries, understanding space in relation to direction, and practicing basic movements... like the difference in running vs. jogging, speed walking, sprinting. Etc. We will continue to add different movement concepts including fitness and practicing basic fitness exercise movements.

3-5: Reviewing Instant activity games that incorporate aerobic and anaerobic fitness. Introducing a few new Activities that incorporate fitness and group cooperation. This

instills teamwork and establishes rapport with classmates. We will be doing some moderate fitness tests in the coming weeks.

MS: We are covering general fitness knowledge. Understanding the FITT principle and how we can apply it to our own daily lives. We will understand how to provide an "active" routine and regimen as a part of our lifestyle now and forward. While discussing these concepts, we will also engage in cooperative activities, we will establish class rapport, teamwork, and challenge ourselves through a series of Fitness Tests. This helps us establish our fitness levels at the beginning of the year, allows us to set goals and standards for ourselves, and gives us a chance to apply the FITT principle and improve as the year progresses.

#### <u>3-5:</u>

- Classroom Procedures, Classroom rules, Alien "Question and Answer" Game- Learning how to compose a question and answer ostinato within a song, "Global Greetings" Game with instruments!
