

English Language Arts

This week we continued to focus on using our time wisely during ELA and working in small groups . Our focus for grammar this week was nouns. We talked about singular and plural nouns both regular and irregular. In writing we focused on prewriting, brainstorming, and free writing. In reading our focus this week was monitoring comprehension. We also started handwriting this week. Finally, we knocked Performance Series out of the park!

Next week we will be working on possessive nouns, more cursive, writing, and spelling. Our comprehension strategy will be making predictions.

Religion

This week the students worked on answering the questions, "Why did God make us?, and How does the Blessed Trinity guide me?" We also did some additional activities focusing on the Trinity.

Next week, we will be focusing on the questions, "Who is Jesus Christ, and What is the Church?" We will follow this up with some fun activities about Jesus and the Church. We will also be working on prayers.

Math

This week we will learn about place value through the ten thousands place and will continue with comparing these numbers using the greater than, less than, and equal to symbols. Students are reviewing how numbers are expressed in standard form, expanded form, and written form. We are also practicing our basic addition fluency.

Next week we will learn how numbers can be ordered, expressed, and compared.

Science

This week we will learn about plant and animal cells, the scientific method, and vocabulary for living organisms.
