Social Studies

This week we focused on science.

Math

This week we worked on 1 to 1 correspondence (pointing to a certain object as we are counting, popping our 10 frame pop-its, moving items from one place to another, etc). We also introduced our 20's frames and how they are exactly like a 10 frame except for the numbers 11-20. We practiced subitizing as well. Next week we will continue our study of number sense.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we read and discussed the story, *Honey...Honey...Lion!* Our focus was on retelling. We broke up the story into Beginning, Middle, and End and highlighted the most important parts. Next week we will read *Make Way for Ducklings* and focus on describing characters.

Grammar

This week we focused on Singular Nouns (The box is big, the dog runs, the baby cries). Next week we will focus on Sentence Structure, continue with Nouns, and introduce Verbs and Adjectives.

Writing

This week we wrote about *Honey...Honey...Lion!*, a story about a selfish Badger who learns a valuable lesson about sharing and teamwork. We also introduced/practiced Daily 5 writing activities.

Theology

In Theology this week,we focused on each Person of the Holy Trinity. We read the creation account from Genesis and learned that the Holy Spirit, although often depicted as a dove, doesn't have an actual body, but is responsible for helping us grow in virtue. We, also, began our Theology of the Body curriculum, which complimented our lesson on creation and emphasized that all creation is a good gift from God to us.

Science

This week we started our unit on plants. We learned about how plants have roots that grow underground and that plants use their leaves to collect sunlight to use to make their own food. We learned the word photosynthesis and listened to a song all about it. We went to the STEM lab to celebrate International Dot Day. There we read the book "The Dot" by Peter H. Reynold and completed various activities using dots.
