### **Social Studies**

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation. We will have a test on the states and capitals for the SE region of the US. on 9/26. In class this week we focused on the impact of the Columbian Exchange. This week we will be learning about the Jamestown and Plymouth settlements.

### Math

This week we used place value to round numbers. We are going to focus on adding and subtracting decimals. The key to success is rewriting the problems vertically so that the decimals align.

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To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (khanacademy.org). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 1st qtr. requirements, due before the end of the quarter are Decimal Place Value, Add Decimals and Subtract Decimals.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we took a test on the spelling/vocabulary words and a quiz on sentence fragments. We also read an excerpt from "Old Yeller" in our *Journeys* anthology, focusing on the story structure and characterization. We also introduced how to use a dictionary.

Next week we will continue working on sentence structure by looking at run-on sentences and how to correct them. Students will have a quiz on this material on Friday. We will also continue working on using the dictionary, and students will have a quiz on that on Wednesday. Finally, we will begin reading *Wonder*, and our study of this novel will focus on story structure,

characterization, and point of view. As we read the novel, students will learn to annotate the text. They will also use this skill when they read their theology text beginning next week.

# Theology

This week students turned in their storyboards for the parts of Mass. We also focused on the saints of St. Ignatius Loyola and St. Joseph.

Next week we will begin studying the theology text, focusing on how we come to know God. As students read this text, they will use the annotation skills we are learning in language arts.

## Science

In science we designed and tested paper airplanes in our lab. We will begin learning about plant and animal cells.
