Social Studies

This Week: Students are learning how to use the elements on a map, and will identify the shapes of the seven continents and locate the five oceans.

 Their Map and Globe book is completed and will be in the Friday Folder to use as a study guide for our quiz next week.

Next Week: We will begin our Continent Unit and students will learn the geographic features of North America, beginning with the Mississippi and Rio Grande Rivers.

Math

This Week: Students will learn place values up to the ten thousandth and hundred thousandths place. They will write these numbers using three different forms - standard, expanded and word form.

Students will have homework Monday- Wednesday night, Please check your child's agenda Monday afternoon.

Next Week: Students will learn to add and subtract within 100, using strategies based on place value, properties of operations, and the relationship between addition and subtraction.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This Week:

Our Word Study this week focused on the closed syllable, which is a very basic and important foundational element of working with multisyllabic words. With the knowledge that a closed syllable dictates a short vowel sound, this will help guide students in identifying similar patterns in unfamiliar and/or more challenging words and support their overall reading. We also honed in on our inner readers which can help us to acknowledge what we've just read, make predictions, and guide us when we become distracted and need to refocus.
