Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation. We are going to be learning about the first colonies in North America.

Students will be tested on sections of the United States. Students need to identify each state and write the correct name and its capital. To make this more manageable, students will only be learning one section at a time. The **SE Region test** will be on Tuesday, September 24th. Students need to identify the correct state by shape/location and be able to write the state and capital name (spelling and capital letters count).

Math

We have been working on estimation, rounding to different place values and finding partial sums with decimals. We will be continuing to add and subtract with decimals. The key to success is to *line up the decimal points before adding or subtracting*. There will be a test on 9/26. Students may use their notes for this test.

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (<u>khanacademy.org</u>). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 1st qtr. requirements are to complete Decimal Place Value, Add Decimals and Subtract Decimals. Students will work on Khan Academy as part of their extended math time.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we continued discussing and analyzing *Wonder*. We have started using text evidence to determine the character traits of some of the main characters. We also worked on identifying and correcting sentence fragments. Students also received the next set of spelling/vocabulary words. This set of 10 come from the first 23 pages of *Wonder*.

Next week, students will continue to read *Wonder* and will review sentence fragments and have a quiz on this material next Friday. We will continue to work with the new spelling/vocabulary words. Students will also be working on a Precept Project next week relating to *Wonder*. This is a fairly short project and will be done entirely in school.

Theology

Students had a test on the Introductory Rites, Liturgy of the Word, and Mass responses this week. We began our study of the Liturgy of the Eucharist and Concluding Rites, and the responses for those parts of the Mass.

Science

We are going to be learning about classification in science. We will have several labs coming up. Please send in empty paper towel rolls if you have any available. Thank you!
