Service Opportunities:

- Martha's Market is not just a marketplace; it is a community-driven initiative dedicated to supporting women's health and the fight against breast cancer. Last year, thanks to the tireless efforts of our volunteers and the generous support of our community, the Women's Committee raised nearly \$185,000. These funds were instrumental in providing 200 free breast health exams to women who are underinsured or uninsured in our community. We also continued contributing to Marianne's Room assisting more than 1,000 women with wigs, scarves, lotions, shampoos, advice and more during their cancer journey as well as funding the spring Fly Fling trip as part of the healing journey. To make this year's event even more successful, we need volunteers to assist with various tasks, including:
 - -Set- Up: Carrying boxes, unloading cars, and potentially directing traffic as vendors set up their booths. We have 45 incredible vendors who will be setting up between 6 and 9am. (Early, I know!)
 - -Break- Down: Assisting vendors with packing up, ensuring the venue is clean and organized after the event, and potentially directing traffic. Breakdown will take from 4 to 5:30pm.
 - -Balloon Delivery: At 10:00 we need a few volunteers to pick up pre-ordered balloon bouquets from The Party Starts Here in Barracks Road and deliver them to about a dozen participating businesses at or close to the downtown mall.

Volunteering at Martha's Market is a fantastic opportunity for students to contribute to a meaningful cause, gain valuable experience, as well as earn community service hours.

6th Grade US History: This week the 6th graders began learning about the Civil War. Next week they will be working on a project where they make historical "baseball cards" for famous Civil War figures.

7th Grade US History: This week the 7th graders practiced their essay writing skills and then began learning about the political changes of the roaring 20s. Next week, on Friday, they will take their test on the 1920s.

8th Grade World History: This week the 8th graders mummified oranges and learned about the ancient Egyptians. Next week they will be comparing and contrasting the Chinese philosophies of Taoism and Confucianism.

Math 6 (Garland): This past week, we explored, visually, how to add integers (positive and negative numbers). This coming week, we will derive the formal/abstract rules of addition and subtraction of integers, based upon the knowledge students have gained.

Pre-Algebra (Garland): This past week, we focused on developing our knowledge of the order of operations associated with expression calculation(GEMDAS). This coming week, we will use these skills to start evaluating algebraic expressions. Students will also learn about real number classifications to fine tune their vocabulary.

Geometry (Garland): This past week, we finished up Coordinate Geometry Transformations. A mini-project on, Advertising Logos, was assigned this past Thursday and is due Monday, September 23rd. A take-home test, on Coordinate Geometry, will be assigned on September 23rd and is due on Tuesday. The rest of the week's plan is to get into terminology associated with Geometry (points, lines, planes, and angles) as well as firm up students' skills using a protractor.

Math 7 (Reid): This past week we worked on simplifying expressions using order of operations. At the end of the week we even started to combine our skills of using order of operations with our integer rules. This is an integral process to their mathematical skill building. I am so impressed with the kid's hard work and dedication to being able to communicate clearly on paper. If you've heard the kids talking about pizza this is what they meant • We also did our first session with Edmentum. This is a helpful computer program that pairs with their MAP testing, helping to fill in any gaps in knowledge that may be there and also push kids to even higher heights mathematically. We will continue to work on Edmentum for 40 minutes every week.

Algebra (Reid): This past week we continued to solve different equations to include absolute value equations as well as equations that have "different" answers such as "no solution" and "infinite number of solutions". Next week, we will start solving various types of word problems as we approach our 2nd test of the quarter. The 7th graders also did our first session with Edmentum. This is a helpful computer program that pairs with their MAP testing, helping to fill in any gaps in knowledge that may be there and also push kids to even higher heights mathematically. We will continue to work on Edmentum for 40 minutes every week.

Composition, Literature, and Language Arts -

6th Grade English Composition (Kerrigan): This week we wrapped up stories, comics, and a test on lessons 1-3 in our vocabulary book. We also started studying prepositions. Next week, we will continue our studies of prepositions. Students will be required to memorize prepositions through song. Verse 1 of the Preposition Song is due on Thursday for a recitation quiz.

6th Grade Literature Vocabulary (Kerrigan): This week we discussed the Great Depression with a nonfiction text in preparation for starting *A Long Way from Chicago* next week. Students have all had opportunities to check out new IRA books and should be reading at home for IRA #2, due Oct. 15. 6th grade has also been working on Edmentum, a program that gives targeted lessons on specific reading skills according to the level of the student.

7th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, the students worked hard to submit their first IRA of the year. They also finished up the Bradbury comparison test and completed a quiz activity analyzing the themes of another spooky Bradbury story, "The Lake." Next week, we will read our final short story ("Jack-in-the-Box") before starting *Dandelion Wine*. 7th grade has also been working on Edmentum, a program that gives targeted lessons on specific reading skills according to the level of the student.

8th Literature/Vocab (Hernandez): This week, the students worked hard to submit their first IRA of the year. They also finished up a discussion of Flannery O'Connor's essay, "The King of the Birds." We began reading and analyzing our first sports-related narrative essay, "Reasons of the Body" by Scott Russell Sanders. This essay looks at sports by examining the relationship between fathers and sons and how this relationship changes over time. Next week, 8th graders will do an analysis quiz on both texts (O'Connor and Sanders).

The students wrote out the Anima Christi prayer in practice for Tuesday's memorization test of the prayer, and they also started thinking about how they would illustrate it for an 81/2 x 11 prayer card. 8th(Mehl): This week we worked on the responses we give during the Introductory Rites of the Mass. We did an exercise of literal reading of Tuesday's Gospel. We went over again the prayers of the Rosary and practiced leading it, in anticipation of our schoolwide praying of the Rosary in October. The students wrote out the Apostles' Creed in practice of Tuesday's memorization test. They also started thinking about how they would illustrate the Creed. We started talking about the Our Father prayer, which is the topic of our next chapter of Catholic Connections. We will continue this next week.

6th Grade Life Science: This week we started to investigate the organelles of cells. Students are working on a project in class. Next week we will practice staining slides for the microscope.

7th Grade Physical Science: This week we finished states of matter with a lab that focused on applications of identifying properties of matter. Next week we start with the atom.

8th Grade Earth Science: This week we investigated the scale of our solar system and students started their projects. Next week we will focus on planets and the life cycle of the star.

Spanish 1 [Part 1–7th grade] (DeMaio): This week the seventh graders took a quiz related to "Telling the time in Spanish." They learned and did activities related to body parts. Expressions like "Me duele la cabeza" =""My head hurts" they learn new vocabulary related to the classroom. They practiced with nouns and differentiating between masculine and feminine nouns.

They also started learning the important and basic rules of the alphabet in Spanish. They did spelling activities in Spanish and oral recordings in which they had to spell their names.

Next week they will learn about the calendar and weather. They will also do a small project in class related to the calendar. They have homework for next week.

IMPORTANT: They will take their first Oral Test on October 2nd for class 7-1 and on October 3rd for class 7-2. This oral test consists of reciting the alphabet in Spanish, recognizing the letters, their names and sounds. Also counting numbers up to 59 and recognizing numbers. Their written exam will be on September 30th. It will include the topics learned during these first months: Greetings, numbers, telling time, body parts, classroom things and directions, alphabet, the calendar and weather.

Spanish 1 [Part 2–8th grade](DeMaio): Eighth graders finished with the topic "Tu día en la escuela"="Your day at school." They also took a quiz related to personal pronouns. They reviewed and practiced conjugating infinitive -ar verbs. They are working on their first oral presentation related to "My classes." **They will be taking their first written exam on September 30th**. Study guides and materials can be found on google classroom.

Next week they will review the topics ¿Desayuno o almuerzo?= Breakfast or lunch? and "Para mantener la salud" =To stay healthy. Grammar Present tense of -er and -ir verbs (conjugation) The plural of adjectives.
