Social Studies

This week we focused on science. Next week we will learn about Johnny Appleseed.

Math

This week we worked on counting and recognizing numbers to 50. We learned about number tracks and number lines. We also learned the difference between a column and a row and how columns count by 10 while a row counts by 1. We learned how to count one more and one less of a given number as well as ten more and ten less.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we read and discussed the story, *Make Way for Ducklings*. Our focus was on Describing a Character, which included identifying outward characteristics as well as inner personality traits. A character's actions often tell us who they are and reveal their motivation, like the mother duck who is very proud of her ducklings. Next week we will read *Real Cowboys* and focus on asking and answering questions about what we read.

<u>Grammar</u>

This week we focused on Sentence Structure, reviewed Nouns, and introduced Verbs and Adjectives. Next week we will focus on asking sentences and how they end with question marks (?).

<u>Writing</u>

This week we wrote about *Make Way for Ducklings*, a story about two ducks searching for the perfect spot to raise their ducklings. Our focus was on describing characters from the story. We also introduced/practiced Daily 5 writing activities about sharing and teamwork. We also introduced/practiced Daily 5 writing activities.

Theology

In Theology this week, we read the stories of Adam and Eve, as well as Noah, from the Bible. We compared the two, talking about how Adam and Eve did not obey God, but how Noah did, and the consequences for all as a result. Next week, we will be preparing for two upcoming feast days. First, the feast of the Archangels on Friday, September 29 and, then, Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7.

Science

This week we finished our unit on plants. We discussed how plants spread their seeds since they cannot walk. We learned that some plants like the squirting cucumber have very extreme ways of spreading their seeds. We also learned how some plants protect themselves from being eaten by animals. In our science notebook we drew and labeled the parts of a plant. In the STEM lab we put our problem solving minds to work and figured out as a group how to make the longest paper chain with very limited supplies. Next week we will talk about the life cycle of an apple to get us ready for our trip to Chiles!
