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## Social Studies

This week in SS, students presented their "Great American Hero" research project. This was a great opportunity for students to see what goes into a research project. The presentations from students were fantastic and all involved learned about not only the people they researched, but also about how to present to large groups.

Next week, we will begin a unit on learning about the 5 regions of Virginia and what each has to offer!

## Math

This week in Math, we finished Unit 3: "Addition and Subtraction Strategies and Algorithms." I have enjoyed the ability to individualize instruction in small groups, and the kids are showing great effort to maximize their time each day in math stations. We took our test over Unit 3 today, and look forward to diving into Multiplication next week in Unit 4.

Our test over Unit 4 will be Tuesday, October 3rd.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week in LA, students continued *The Tiger Rising*. We continued some of the real learning that makes 4th grade such a great learning experience. Students are learning how to develop significant ideas about characters that are backed up by evidence from the text. The writing that students did this week was incredible! This will be a turning point for students as they will now start doing this work without even knowing it!

# Theology

This week in Theology, we have been focused on Unit 1 Lesson 3: "Why did God make us?" We have emphasized the importance of being made in the image and likeness of God with in-class activities highlighting our uniqueness, role plays demonstrating the importance of

faith in God's plan for creation, and in reflective Journal entries that focus on saying "yes" to God in various aspects of our life. Our <u>Unit 1 Lesson 3 quiz is scheduled for Wednesday, September 27th.</u>

## Science

In Science this week we began Ch. 1, and have been focused on Lessons 1 and 2: "How Are Living Things Classified?" We enjoyed a study of plant and animal cells, and how scientists classify organisms based on microscopic multicellular and unicellular structures. We looked closely at plants and enjoyed our activity in the STEM lab this week working with carnations, sunflowers and food dye to better understand capillary action and the way the stems of the flowers work to bring water and nutrients to the leaves. This was the perfect introduction to better understand vascular and nonvascular plant classifications.
