Science/Social Studies

Ms. Wawner's class finished up their unit on the 5 senses this week and focused on smell and taste. Students played "Guess that Animal Nose" and tried identifying different aromas they

smelled without looking. They learned about taste buds and how humans taste 5 main flavors. Ask your students what umami is and see what they say! Next week, we will do a Social Studies unit and explore the country of Guatemala, our designated country for Hispanic Heritage Month. We will be learning about the Mayans, coffee, and the Quetzal bird! Ms. Shank's class completed experiments that helped us understand how states of matter can change. The students were given an ice-cube in a tray. The ice cube was mixed with baking soda and a "surprise" inside. The students dropped vinegar onto the ice cube and observed the chemical reaction. They had fun finding their surprise. We also tested whether a plain ice cube would melt slower or faster than an ice cube with salt. Our last experiment the students explored density by predicting and testing what fruits and vegetables will sink or float. Our unit next week will be the Seasons leading to the following week where we explore Autumn/Fall.

Math

Ms. Shank and Ms. Wawner's class will continue working on numbers 1-10, both recognizing the numbers and one to one correspondence by making sets. Some of the students know how to count the objects but do not recognize their numerals. We continue to sequence numbers. Ms. Wawner will introduce ten frames and students will start practicing how to write their numerals. Ms. Shank will begin differentiated math groups.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Ms. Wawner's class studied the letter T this week and loved reading books and making art featuring turtles and trees. At the end of the week, we reviewed the letters and sounds we have practiced so far and compared them. Next week we will focus on the letter P. Our class also started talking about the key elements of a story (characters, setting, and plot) and tried to identify them in each book we read. Ms. Shank's class completed an author study of Laura Numeroff, the author of "If You Give a Mouse a Cookie" and "If You Give A Pig a Pancake". We graphed our favorite cookies, counted groups of cookies, and sequenced the stories. We completed our own craft of a Mouse and chose something that the mouse might want to eat. Our letter for the week was the letter A. We focused mostly on the short vowel sound of A but did talk about how letter A is a vowel, a magic letter because it has 2 sounds. We also talked about the letter T. We will also be reading a lot of books about the seasons.

Theology

Ms. Shank's class learned about what a Priest is, what the Mass is, and things we see when we go to Mass. Next week we will introduce a unit on Noah's Ark.

Ms. Wawner's class practiced their prayers this week and stored them in their prayer pocket/purse so they can practice at home. Students loved learning sign language for The Lord's Prayer and practicing it with their Faith Buddies. Next week students will learn about Mass and symbols of the Catholic faith.
