## 2nd Grade

Hello Rainbow Cheetah and Silly Sloth families!

After reading daily clues this week, our sweet students solved the mystery of our new class pet! Ask your child about Spencer the Stinkbug and the cool facts they learned all about stink bugs! Spencer has visited our classrooms and has even been spotted at recess!

While collecting natural materials, the Devlin family noticed a monarch caterpillar on some milkweed and very kindly brought this darling insect to school! With a play on words, we have named our monarch caterpillar Elizabeth in honor of England's longest reigning monarch, Queen Elizabeth II. Elizabeth happily ate like a queen prior to preparing to form her chrysalis. After Elizabeth emerges (about 10 days), we'll carefully observe the markings on her wings to determine if we correctly guessed the gender of our caterpillar! ### Math

Following our unit on Measurement, we are now delving into Place Value. The Rainbow Cheetahs and Silly Sloths are building and drawing 3-digit numbers using base-10 blocks, identifying the value of numbers in each place (hundreds, tens, and ones), writing numbers in both standard and expanded form, comparing numbers, and so much more! We'll conclude this unit next Friday, September 30 with a test.

## Literacy

We are thrilled to begin spelling instruction next week! Each student will receive explicit small group instruction, followed up with daily activities and a homework choice board. Since the Silly Sloths and Rainbow Cheetahs will be learning how to complete a variety of new activities associated with spelling, our first word lists will be studied for TWO weeks. At the end of the two weeks, our sensational spellers will take a test. Tests will occur on Fridays. The first spelling test will occur on Friday, October 7.

## Religion

This week, students were captivated as they heard the story of Punchinello, Eli, and the Wemmicks in Max Lucado's "You Are Special" and made connections between Eli the woodworker as God, and the Wemmicks as us. They all declared "God made me special" as they released what others thought of them. Then, students learned about how they are made in the *imago dei*, the "image & likeness of God." They *reflected* that they are like a mirror that, when facing God, can reflect his goodness and love towards others and out into the world!

Next week, we will finish up our study on how we are made in God's image and then move into a look at what our conscience is and how we build virtue. Also, students will be getting their first bit of Religion homework! We will be starting to think about what Saint we would like to research for our All Saints Day project! Your future Saint will bring home a paper where they will select the top three Saints they would like to *possibly* research. The goal is to make sure that we have no repeats in our Communion of Saints!

### **Social Studies**

The Silly Sloths and Rainbow Cheetahs are SO engaged in our study of Native Americans! This week, we kicked off the unit handling native artifacts kindly loaned to us by the Hinek family! After learning about the "three sisters," dugout canoes, wigwams, and daily life, our sweet second graders built a wigwam village, using success criteria to show all they know about the landscape, housing, jobs, transportation, food, and clothing of the Powhatan tribe of the Eastern Woodlands.

Next week, the Lakota tribe of the Great Plains will be featured. Throughout this unit, we will revisit geography with a specific focus on the United States.
