Science

This week we will be identifying characteristics of living and nonliving things in an ecosystem, plant and animal cell structure, and learning the steps of the scientific method.

Next week students will learn about animal habitats and how living things grow and change in their environment. We will also continue to learn the steps of the scientific method.

Social Studies

This week students will be finishing elements of a map and will be introduced to the geographic features of North America.

Next week students will learn about the Rio Grande River, Mississippi River, the five Great Lakes, the Rockies and Appalachian Mountain ranges in North America.

Math

This week we learned the place value forms of writing numbers- standard, expanded and word form up to the hundred thousands place, as well as, identify ways to represent the same amount of money using different combinations of coins and bills.

Next week we will learn how numbers can be expressed, ordered, and compared . We will also learn how to round numbers up to the tens, hundreds, and thousands place. Students will continue to work on counting currency and coins.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This Week:

Our focus was on Pronouns, as well as Open Syllables (ends in a vowel and makes a long vowel sound - **so**, **pi**lot, and **hero**), Affixes: ing, e/es, ed, un, and re. We also worked on organizing our writing into a concise summary by using the Somebody Wanted But So Then strategy, as well as discussed how to describe characters in our writing.

Next Week:

- -Daily Grammar Review: Focus: Common and Proper Nouns, Capitalization
- -Word Study: Vowel-Consonant-e Syllables (backb**one**, panc**ake**, and campf**ire**), Affixes: ly and review of ing, e/es, ed, un, and re
- -Writing: Procedural Writing (e.g., How to Make Cookies)

Homework:

-Word Study (M-Th) - 10 min. Students do not need to turn anything in.

Reading

This Week:

We finished our discussion of the book, The Raft and reviewed vocabulary. We also dove into character development and explored how other characters can influence and become catalysts for change on the main character.

Next Week:

- -Featured Story: Saturdays and Teacakes (Memoir)
- -Focus Skill: Mental Images
- -Vocabulary: steep, ripe, dew, nibble, sift, trudge, coast, humming, pavement, glider, sputter, ferns

Not Homework but Recommended:

Nightly Reading (M-Th) - Approximately 20 min. Students should indicate the number of minutes read each night/week in their planner.

Religion

This Week:

We worked through Lesson 1 in our Religion textbook and asked the questions, How do we know God? and How do I tell others about God?. We also studied the following Faith Words; Covenant, Gospel, Sacred Tradition, and Paschal Mystery. Lastly, it was fun to get to sit with our Faith Buddies (7th Grade) at mass. We will continue to do so all year, as well as have regular get-togethers with them.

Next Week:

We will be working in our Religion textbook (Lesson 2) and asking the questions, Who Is God and How do we see his love? We will explore the Blessed Trinity. We will continue learning about the structure of the mass. There are four parts of Mass: Introductory Rites, the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and the Concluding Rite.
