## **Academics**

- 1. We will be working on the letter I. Because this is a vowel I will continue to do some differentiation with some of the students. I am going to work with them on hearing the short letter I in the middle of consonant vowel consonant words, (pit, bin, i.e.).
- 2. In Math we continue to work on number sense. Some students still need to work on counting on and recognizing their numbers. I did an informal assessment on Thursday to collect some data. I will be sending home those sheets. You will notice at the top of the paper I either put a check, meaning they are doing fine, the word counting, meaning they are struggling to count on, or I put a #, meaning they are struggling identifying numbers. Any practice at home is great. Just as an FYI. I also have a little saying that goes with the numbers to help them identify visually what a number looks like. Number 1 is "a stick", 2 is "around the track and back that is how you make a 2", 3 is "around the tree, around the
- tree that is how you make a 3", 4 is "down and across and down once more that is how you make a 4", 5 is "a hat and a neck and a big fat belly", 6 is "a curve and a loop and a 6 throws a hoop", 7 is "across and down from heaven that is how you make a 7", 8 is "8 starts with S but don't you wait, go back up and close the gate", 9 is "make a balloon and slide down the line that is how you make a 9", 10 is " make a 1 and make a 0 that's the end with number 10". If you want to use this to practice then we are using the same language.
- 3. We continue to work on pencil grip, the "pinch". You will notice that most of their work is tracing using a marker. The thickness of the marker allows them to get a sense of how to grip before they actually begin using a pencil.
- 4. The students have been coloring in their names. I will continue to do that and assess whether they are able to recognize their own name.
- 5. In religious education we are going to talk about families and being a part of God's family.

6. Since the leaves are beginning to turn I will continue to talk about seasons. I would like to do a nature walk around the school and have the students collect leaves for a project, (possibly fitting in some science activities). This is dependent on the weather.
