Social Studies

This week we learned about Johnny Appleseed to wrap up our lessons on plants and apples.

Math

This week we worked on counting, recognizing, And writing numbers to 50. We learned that some words need a hyphen when we write them with words. We also learned how to find a missing number on a number line to 50, using a number chart to 50, and how to put numbers in order to 50. Next week we will continue practicing number sense with numbers to 50 and begin exploring numbers to 120.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

Reading

This week we read and discussed the story, *Real Cowboys*., which is nonfiction and aims to paint the real picture of who cowboys are and what they really do. Our focus was on asking questions and identifying question words (Who, What, Where, Why, When, and How, etc.) while reading. We stressed how good readers ask questions before they read, while they read, and after they read. Next week we will read *Hoot and Peep*, and focus on making connections (text to self, text to text, and text to world).

<u>Grammar</u>

This week we looked at asking sentences (?) vs. telling sentences (.) and how to tell them apart. Identifying words like, who, what, where, when, why, and how, can help determine what type of sentence it is and what punctuation is needed. Next week we will talk about onomatopoeia- a word that mimics the sound of the actual thing or person described.

Writing

This week we wrote about being a cowboy/cowgirl and focused on the type of sentences we were writing (asking and telling) and punctuation that was needed. We further practiced our writing skills during Daily 5 writing activities.

Theology

In Theology this week, we began our study of the lives of the saints by talking about what a saint is, how saints can intercede on our behalf, and how each of us is called to be saint. We also looked at Saints Michael, Raphael, and Gabriel as we prepared for the Feast of the Archangels. Students chose a saint to learn more about and will be completing a report on their chosen saint during Theology class over the next couple weeks. Next week, in addition to working on our reports, we will focus on Our Lady of the Rosary as we prepare for her feast day on October 7.

Science

This week we will talk about the life cycle of an apple to get us ready for our trip to Chiles! Next week we will start our unit on matter.
