Social Studies

Students continued to learn about the countries of Bolivia and Mexico which are our focus countries for National Hispanic Heritage month.

Math

Each day we graph the weather for the day, add a number to our September calendar, draw a circle in our 180 day ten frame chart, and color in a number in our 100s chart. Students are learning to recognize and write numbers 0-20. In addition to our regular calendar routine.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

We continued sight words this week: little, down, can, see, not . Next week, our sight words will be: one, my, me, big, come. Students are working on pencil grip and writing on the lines. Students are learning the structure of Daily Five. We are working hard to help students build independence by approaching tasks with the following guidelines: get started right away, work the whole time, stay in one spot, work quietly, build your stamina. You may want to try this language at home with your child's household tasks. They will be surprised that you are using those phrases.

Theology

We watched a theology movie about the rosary. Every Friday we also go to the chapel. The last two times in the chapel, I showed the students rosary beads and taught them about it. In October, every Thursday, we will be praying one decade of the rosary as a whole school outside on the basketball court. Eighth grade will lead us in the rosary.

Science

We went to the STEAM lab twice this week as we do every week. We conducted an experiment with making boats out of aluminum foil and then adding pennies and other objects to it until it sank. The students made predictions and then some were able to remember how many pennies there were. We will continue talking about the changes of the season and do more apple activities as well as pumpkin activities.
