Social Studies

This past week, students became textbook "detectives" and learned how to use textbooks and all of the nonfiction text features within it. We also began to learn about Virginia and all that it has to offer!

In Math this week we have been focused on addition and subtraction operations, and strategies for solving multi-step word problems.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This past week, we continued *The Tiger Rising*. Students are thoroughly engaged with this novel. We learned the importance of synthesized retelling and envisioning the story as we read. We will continue this working with realistic fiction texts next week. These practices will aid students in becoming greater readers and writers!

Religion

In Religion we have been focused on the essential question, "Why did God make us?" We took our Unit 1 Lesson 3 quiz and are now focused on Unit 1 Lesson 4: "Who is Jesus Christ?" We have enjoyed learning more about Mary, and have similarly reflected on what God asks of us. We highlighted important topics like the Immaculate Conception, the Incarnation and Jesus' Resurrection.

There will be a Unit 1 Lesson 4 Quiz on Thursday, October 6th.

Science

In Science this week we have been learning about heredity, genes and traits. We learned that a combination of genes make us all unique individuals that resemble our parents and grandparents, and that our traits make us the distinct humans we are, too! We enjoyed our practice in being book detectives when we learned about the life cycle and reproduction of plants. We worked on text referencing strategies to strengthen our critical thinking and study skills, and enjoyed our "inherited characteristics" mini-lab.

There will be a Chapter 2 Test on Friday, October 7th.
