## Junior Kindergarten

#### <u>Math</u>

We continue to work on number sense (counting, one to one correspondence, and sequencing numbers). Any practice at home is greatly appreciated. Number sense is critical to all future mathematical concepts and operations. We have our daily/weekly questions and graph our answers.

## Language Arts/Reading/Writing

In Language Arts we will begin our study of the letter I. Letter I is a somewhat difficult letter. It is very close to the sound that the short E makes. One way for students to practice the difference is to notice that when they make the letter I, their chin will go down. With the short E, the mouth goes sideways. We will review this, as well as practice identifying and writing I.

## <u>Religion</u>

Students are learning about the rosary. We will begin going outside first thing in the morning to say a decade of the rosary led by the 8th grade. This will start on October 4th and continue for the month. It is important that students be here on time. As soon as we say the Pledge at 8:05, we exit the building to the blacktop.

### <u>Science</u>

Ms. Shank's class will continue our study of nocturnal and diurnal animals. We will start a study of owls and make a lapbook about all of the things we learn. Ms. Wawner continues to study the 5 senses. This week, students learned about taste and the 5 flavors. Ask your students if they can remember some of them! We taste-tested different foods with different flavors and ended the week with an apple-tasting. Next week we will finish the 5 senses by exploring touch.
