Social Studies

In history we will be learning about early US history and how we came to be a nation. Students will be tested on sections of the United States. Students need to identify each state and write the correct name and its capital. To make this more manageable, students will only be learning one section at a time. The **NE Region test** will be on Thursday, September 12th. Students need to identify the correct state by shape/location and be able to write the state and capital name (spelling and capital letters count).

Math

We will be starting the year by reviewing place value to the thousandths place and to the millions place. We will learn to solve decimal numbers problems using all operations. We will begin working with prime numbers this week.

To reinforce math concepts and skills, students are assigned sections for Khan Academy (<u>khanacademy.org</u>). This is for a grade. Students have their login and password in their planner. The 1st qtr. requirements are to complete Decimal Place Value, Add Decimals and Subtract Decimals. Students will work on Khan Academy as part of their extended math time.

Language Arts/Reading/Writing

This week we continued to review the identification of subjects and predicates. Students took a quiz on this concept on Friday. We also continued to work with the spelling/vocabulary words from "A Package for Mrs. Jewls". Finally, we also started discussing and analyzing point of view in literature.

Next week, students will have a test on the spelling and meaning of the set of 10 words. They will also have a reading test on point of view. For this test, they will be given two passages (like we have worked with in class), and they will identify the point of view as being either first person, third person limited, or third person omniscient. There is a handout on these concepts in the reading section of students' binders, and a copy is also on GC/Reading. Next week, students will also begin our sentence editing activities, where we practice editing work for spelling, punctuation, and grammar. Students will also begin reading the novel *Wonder* mid-week next week.

Theology

We have continued studying the Introductory Rites and Liturgy of the Word, including the responses that are said during these sections of the Mass.

Next week, we will introduce the Saint of the Month and continue to explore the first two sections of Mass. There will be a quiz on that material early the week of September 16. All new students who have not yet recited the CCS daily prayers should try to recite them by next Friday, September 13. If your child is not Catholic and needs another week to work on these, they may recite them as late as September 20.

Science

We have been reviewing the Scientific Method. We will begin focusing on plant and animal cells.
